USE TEST STRIPS PREVENT AN OVERDOSE

Test every street drug for illicit fentanyl. Fentanyl test strips can detect if this deadly synthetic opioid is in any type of drug.

No test is 100% accurate—drugs may still contain fentanyl even if the test strips show a negative result. Test strips also can't indicate how much fentanyl is in a drug or how strong it is.



Why is fentanyl so dangerous?

Fentanyl is 50 times stronger than heroin and 100 times stronger than morphine.

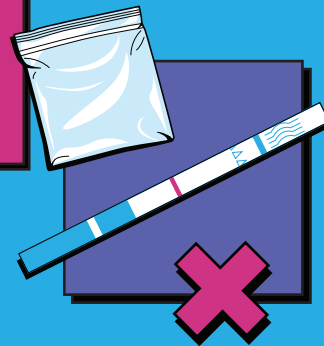
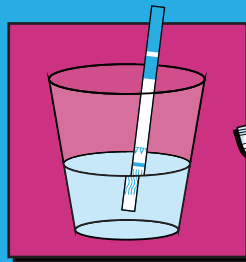
Where is it showing up?

It's in most street drugs, including cocaine, meth, and counterfeit Percocet® or Adderall® pills.

How do fentanyl test strips work?

1. Dilute the drugs in water.
2. Dip the test strip for 15 seconds.
3. Wait three minutes, then look for one or two lines.

ONE LINE: Fentanyl is present—don't take it.
